eJuggle has a new look!

The eJuggle magazine site has been upgraded to feature more distinctive branding and a more powerful set of navigation tools.

The material is now presented under major headings such as Tutorials, Profiles, Current Events, Opinion/Theory, Fest Reviews, and Multimedia. The new navigation bar stays at the top of the page as you navigate through the content.

There are also links to popular social networking sites so that you can stay involved with fast breaking IJA news.

Many of the articles at eJuggle are reserved for IJA members. The IJA does provide "service to jugglers", but it also likes to serve its members well. That is why you have to log in to eJuggle to access premium content that is just for IJA members.

The username for logging in is the email address that the IJA membership database has on file for you. All members were sent a password in January to use for logging in to eJuggle. The IJA does not yet have an integrated system of passwords, hence this special password is just for eJuggle.

If you don't know your eJuggle password, click on "Forgot your password?" near the login box and provide the email address listed with your membership. A new password will be emailed to you. If you've changed your email address recently, contact memberships@juggle.org to get your address updated.

AmaLuna, a review by Don Lewis

Cirque du Soleil's latest touring show is titled AmaLuna. It is loosely based on a coming of age ceremony for Miranda, the daughter of Prospera. The costumes are lavish, as they always are at the Cirque.

One of the principal characters is Cali, a half man half lizard, played superbly by Victor Kee. Just prior to the show, he struts around the audience, climbs the tent poles and playfully dumps popcorn on the spectators. His costume features a highly flexible tail that he maneuvers as if it were part of him. As a principal character in the show, he appears frequently, often enticed by Miranda holding out an acrylic ball since she considers him a pet.

His main juggling sequence comes in the second half of the show. He performs on top of a large plastic half globe of water which is placed at center stage. Rather than carrying balls with him, balls are dropped from the top of the tent - a considerable distance above. He starts with one ball that is subjected to a series of very fluid and rapid contact juggling moves. He throws that ball away, and two more drop down. Rather than add balls to those he already has, he throws them away and new ones drop each time he moves up to more. He finishes by kicking up a flaming ball and adding it to the five he had. The crowd was very impressed. Staying in his half-creature persona allowed him to move sinuously while juggling. Serious eye candy, ladies.

There was much more manipulation in this show, There was a number that featured antipodists who juggled human partners. Those partners were manipulating meteors (like double ended poi). It was impressive to see the meteors

spinning while the manipulators were being tossed around. For the finale, the meteors had bright lights that covered the stage in moving light.

There was a fascinating balance number where a lady quietly balanced increasingly large and heavy palm leaf ribs on each other, making an intricate moving sculpture. At the end, she remove the tiniest rib and the whole thing collapsed to thunderous applause.

Other acts featured unicycling, teeterboard, chinese pole, tight wire, aerial straps, and uneven bars. The huge water bowl does get used as Miranda drops into it from on high and does some soaking wet contortion and hand balancing.

The cast is largely female in this show which was directed by New York based Diane Paulus as a homage to women. The on-stage band is all female, and they spend a lot of time on stage seriously rocking out.

I enjoyed the show a lot. I was sitting in the cheap seats almost behind the stage and almost behind a supporting pillar, but the view was still good. No seat is too far away from the stage. And they do supply extra cushions if the person in front of you is huge. I

happened to be near the pillar that all the artists and technicians were climbing up and down to get to the technical ring at the top of the tent. They all clipped in before climbing, so safety is clearly a priority.

AmaLuna is in Montreal for a few more weeks before moving on to Quebec City, Toronto, Vancouver, and the USA.
