Special Workshops

Pattern, Trick, and Sequence Creation by Patrik Elmnert Tuesday and Wednesday, 10am-12pm

Jugglers of any skill level, from beginner to expert, are invited to join this two-day special workshop which examines how tricks, patterns, and sequences are created. In this workshop, Patrik will share tools on how to randomly generate juggling tricks, patterns, and sequences on paper that directly translate into juggling. It will be focused on each individual's level and interest within juggling. If you've never made a trick, pattern, or sequence before, this is a great start! The grid you will learn to create will do all the thinking for you. If you've created and composed a lot of juggling in the past, this technique is going to make combinations of throws happen that you wouldn't have imagined before.

Take Your Juggling to New Heights by Richard Kennison Thursday and Friday, 10am-12pm

Kellin Quinn, Thom Wall, Tony Pezzo, Ashley Ellis, Book Kennison, Cameron Ritter, Casey Boehmer, and Nate Sorrill — What do these incredible jugglers have in common? They have all been coached and/or trained by Richard Kennison.

In this two-day special workshop, he will have you look at some of his practical ideas for building a better foundation for your juggling and for creating a juggling act that sets you apart from others.

This workshop is designed for jugglers who have not yet mastered five ball juggling but want to. (Please bring a 48 inch long wooden dowel of quarter-sized diameter to this workshop.) Richard does not create juggling robots but helps performers get better at juggling and helps them create the kind of act that is unique to them. Richard is known for meeting jugglers where they are and helping them get going in the direction of where they want to be.

Poi Technique and Exploration by Cyrille Humen Wednesday and Thursday, 1pm-3pm

In this two-day special workshop, Cyrille will present an exploration of various poi techniques including throwing, contact, manipulation, spinning, and more. Flowers, Body Tracing, and Contact Poi techniques will all be covered. Beginning to advanced spinners are welcome.

From clean sequences to chaotic improvisation, participants will search for spontaneous and intuitive movement, shuffle their tricks and experiment with them in order to break out of known patterns and create new ones. Let's get surprised!

The IJA World Joggling Championships will take place on Saturday morning August 2nd at 8am at the Purdue University track.

Sign up for joggling online on the fest registration site by June 30 to save \$10. Joggling is one of the add-on items you can purchase online when placing your festival registration order. If you have already signed up for IJA you can still go back to the festival order page and sign up for joggling. Again, if you do this online by the June 30 online registration deadline, you will save \$10 on your joggling fee.

1600 meters - 3 balls

100 meters - 3 balls

100 meters - 5 balls

400 meters - 3 balls

800 meters - 3 balls

4 x 100 meters - 3 balls

100 meters - 7 balls*

400 meters - 5 balls**

* – competitors in 100 meters 7 balls event must be able to demonstrate a solid 7 ball pattern prior to entry

** – competitors in 400 meters 5 balls event must have completed the 100 meters 5 balls in less than 90 seconds

IJA Numbers Championships - Rules Changes, by Scott Cain and Merry Spahr

We hope that everyone is looking forward to the IJA Festival at Purdue in a few weeks. We'd like to let everyone know that there are some important changes to the rules for the IJA Numbers Championships this year. We believe that these changes will provide some flexibility for competitors and shorten the event.

Specifically, the time allotment for each entrant will now be only four minutes per event.

In the Preliminary Qualifying Rounds, during the first two minutes, the entrant must achieve at least one qualifying run of the minimum number of objects in order to continue with the remaining two minutes. In the Championships Finals, each competitor will be given the full four minutes (with no stipulation of needing a qualifying run during the first two minutes).

There will no longer be time allotments for each level (i.e., two minutes for 8 balls, two minutes for 9 balls, etc), but rather a single four-minute allotment for each event (i.e., Individual Balls).

The competitor now also has an option to call for a one-minute time-out during the Finals.

Festival Housing Options

It seemed simple enough last year when the IJA selected Purdue as the site of the 2014 festival. The residence hall option was going to be advantageous. Unfortunately Purdue has imposed new, stringent conditions on their housing.

For the IJA, this effectively means that youth and families cannot be accommodated in the Purdue residence halls.

This recent change has caught everyone by surprise. The IJA festival team and Board members have been working very hard to find out exactly what is possible and to get the best rates. If you are 18 or over, you can register for a single or an inexpensive half of a double room in the residence halls.

Our festival team and the local convention bureau have also been working overtime to negotiate preferential rates at the local hotels to compensate for the new residence hall restrictions. Several hotels have offered interesting rate packages for the IJA festival. Check out the hotel information on page 6 and on the IJA website.

Between the residence halls and the hotels, there are affordable accommodations for everyone. Make any hotel reservations soon, as some hotels have limited space.

The IJA regrets this late housing surprise, but it was fully beyond our control.

IJA Fest: Purdue Residence Halls -- Reserve Rooms (deadline 5pm ET July 11)

Please note that due to Purdue policies, on-campus housing in Purdue University Residences is **available only to adults 18 and older**. Families traveling with youth under 18: please look at the options we list for Nearby Hotels on the next page including some with special IJA rates.

Purdue offers housing for IJA jugglers 18 or older in two residence hall complexes on campus, both located within a short walk of the gym and workshops:

- Hillenbrand Hall, an 8-story double-winged suite-style building with co-ed floors. Each suite has two private double rooms (with two single beds in each), joined by a semi-private bathroom. The bathroom is shared between the four guests in the two adjoining bedrooms. Hillenbrand Hall is double-occupancy only; no single rooms are available. Guests staying at Hillenbrand pay \$27/person per night plus 12% tax, for a total of \$30.24 per person per night.
- First Street Towers, a set of three 5-story buildings, built new in 2010, with single rooms only, each with a private bathroom. Guests staying at First Street Towers pay \$60/person per night plus 12% tax, for a total of \$67.20 per person per night for a private single room with private bath. No double rooms.

See the IJA <u>Purdue Housing Chart</u> for detailed information on all the features and amenities available in each building.

Please note these important facts about the on-campus housing options at Purdue:

- Alcohol is not permitted in Purdue University Residences. This
 includes possessing, consuming, transporting, distributing or
 being in the presence of alcohol. Anyone found in violation of
 this policy is subject to termination of the housing contract and
 immediate removal from the residence hall.
- All rooms in First Street Towers are single occupancy only. Fire safety codes prohibit more than one person per room in First Street Towers.
- Mixed-gender rooms for adults are available at Hillenbrand Hall. Married couples, adult friends traveling in a group or any other mixed-gender or same-gender group of adults (18 and up) may choose Hillenbrand Hall for their housing and specify whom they want to share a bedroom with. It is not possible to specify suite mates in advance, but suite mates may be coordinated on-site if all parties are in agreement.

- When reserving your housing preference using Purdue's online system, you will be required to pay a non-refundable registration fee equal to one night's stay. THIS FEE IS NON-REFUNDABLE. The registration fee is applied to your total bill for the week, which will be payable in full upon arrival.
- A wired Internet connection is provided in each sleeping room via a standard Ethernet jack. Wireless Internet (Wi-Fi) is not available in the residence halls. Purdue will provide a Purdue network ID and password for Internet access on the Purdue wired network. Bring an Ethernet cable to plug into your computer for Internet access in either residence hall.
- Free Wi-Fi Internet access is available in other buildings at Purdue via AT&T. You will be prompted with instructions when you connect to the AT&T Wi-Fi network on campus.
- Remember that Purdue residence halls are not hotels. There is no daily housekeeping service, no TV, coffeemaker, microwave or mini-fridge in the rooms; linens are exchanged at the front desk upon request; you may be more comfortable bringing an extra pillow, an alarm clock, your shower amenities, a plastic cup, etc.

All housing reservations for Purdue University Residences must be made in advance online by **5pm EDT on July 11, 2014**. No on-site or walk-up accommodations are available.

Finally, remember that you are making your Purdue University Residences accommodation plans and paying your Purdue University Residences registration fees directly with Purdue University. The International Jugglers' Association is not involved with and has no control over or knowledge of your Purdue University Residences registration or payment, and cannot and will not be involved in case of errors, cancellations, changes of plans or any other disputes.

When using the Purdue website (link below) to reserve residence hall rooms, you will specify your check-in and check-out dates. Note that, if you go back to edit the page those dates are on, the dates will be reset to the default, so double check them before leaving that page.

Kurios, reviewed by Don Lewis

Cirque du Soleil's latest production is called Kurios - Cabinet des Curiosités. Back in the 16th century, the word cabinet typically referred to a room rather than a piece of furniture. Thus the wunderkammer, or cabinet of curiosities, was a room where unusual and provocative items were displayed, usually private collections. This concept evolved into modern day museums.

The entertainment industry embraced the concept. In the 18th century a wunderkammer style of show was a loose assemblage of unrelated acts. In North America, this style evolved as vaudeville. In recent years, the Australian circus group Circa toured a show called Wunderkammer very much in that style.

Cirque du Soleil's version of this genre is set in an alternate, yet familiar, reality where mechanical things take life and assert their personalities. The set in the familiar CDS tent environment is decorated with gears and pipes disguising the support pillars. Add in a personage who seemed like a mad inventor and we seem to have been deposited in a steampunk world.

The opening number features most of the cast. Some of them run around the perimeter of the ring wearing hats which are the engine and cars of a steam train. An odd looking train shaped like a accordion caterpillar There is an apparatus with several nozzles that have gold balls apparently balanced on jets of air. Personages in lab coats rush about moving machines that had littered the stage before the show. Acrobats flip and bounce around in a frenzy of scattered activities.

A popular activity was a juggler who provided the only juggling activity in the whole show. He raced around the stage juggling balls and what appeared to be plastic hands. Three clubs proved to be popular with the audience. He quickly established that you can wow a crowd with basic tricks. It was fun to watch in the midst of the rest of the things going on on stage. The juggler is Gabriel Beaudoin from Quebec City.

I was caught by surprise by one move which I hadn't seen before. While juggling three clubs, he threw one really high. Normally that means that you wait for the club to come back down before continuing to juggle, or you do some other trick while waiting. In this case, the juggler himself flew up in the air, restarting his pattern before the club had a chance to fall. He kept juggling in mid-air. It was one of those "did I just see that?" moments. He did something similar when he was lowered back to the stage in time to catch a falling club and keep on juggling. It was a memorable piece of stagecraft and ingenuity, to say nothing of timing between the juggler and the riggers lofting him.

The show then proceeded on with the usual procession of individual acts. Interestingly, there were no overwhelmingly high acts, like aerial trapeze rigs. Each act was more or less at stage level and easily visible.

A girl used a bicycle suspended in the air as an ingenious trapeze. A small version of a circus ring was wheeled on stage as an invisible circus. A unicycle swayed along a high wire. Something jumped from a tower to splash in a bucket, but the only reality was a ringmaster directing his invisible artists.

A clever chair balancing act had the artist climbing an ever higher stack of chairs to reach a suspended lamp. Partway through the act, the lighting changed and we could see that the exact mirror image of the act was being performed upside down from the top of the tent. An interesting twist on a classic act.

A giant mechanical hand appeared on stage and was used as a base for four contortionists. Two men who had appeared as twins in various inter-act sequences became a pair of aerial strap flyers, crossing the stage and parts of the audience. An amusing clown sequence had a clown invite an audience member up on stage to sit on a couch. The clown then proceeded to transform into an outrageously affectionate cat.

An impressive rolla bolla act featured the usual balancing on cylinders that seemed to roll within millimeters of disaster. To add to the difficulty, the entire routine was done on a swaying Washington trapeze as everything rolled back and forth.


At the intermission, riggers set up what appeared to be a giant net across the stage. In fact it turned the entire stage into a trampoline. Lots of acrobats could jump at once which lead to the possibility of multiple tricks or amplifying another flyer's efforts.
