IJA Board Nominations Close May 15, 2015,

Sometimes I think democracy only works in the midst of turmoil. When things seem to be going well, people don't get involved, and they don't bother to vote.

The IJA requires a Board of Directors. Directors get voted in for a two year term, in alternating years. Without an elected Board, we can't really function. We have enthusiastic participants at the IJA festival and volunteers who manage popular programs. But every year it is a struggle to constitute an executive. Why is that, when all the members want the IJA to succeed?

Basically, the Board helps volunteers make good things happen. Directors are protected from unavoidable risks by directors and officers insurance. Directors hold a fiduciary role. That simply means that they must act in the best interests of the IJA, similar to being responsible for a child that cannot legally act for itself.

The hard jobs, like bookkeeping, are performed under contract. The IJA finances are not complicated and are currently stable.

Get involved. Submit a nomination. Remember that the best person for the job may be staring back at you in the mirror each morning. Less experienced people than you have been on volunteer boards and made a difference -- you can too.

Remember: ***You need a passport*** to enter Canada. Just as importantly, you will need one to re-enter your own country. Passport cards and enhanced driver's licenses can only be used at land crossings; you cannot use them to travel by air. Apply now -- it can take two months.

Border Formalities for Entry to Canada, *by Don Lewis*

The IJA festival has been granted recognition by the Canadian Border Services Authority. The official *Letter of Recognition* is reproduced on the following pages for you to consult.

Visiting jugglers may find this letter useful as they transit the border. The document gives the CBSA officials at the border a reference which demonstrates that you are attending a documented event. As long as you have your passport, you and your juggling paraphernalia should have no difficulty entering Canada.

The information contained in the letter is mostly of interest to vendors who wish to temporarily import goods for sale at the festival.

Items such as display booths and display items can be temporarily imported free of duty and tax under a special tariff. You should have a list of these items to avoid delays.

The Gauntlet is specifically mentioned in the letter. The materials for this challenge will pass unhindered. While the

letter mentions consulting the food importation section, that is principally for for importing exotic woods and avoiding noxious insects. An unofficial contact suggested to me that the CBSA is not particularly interested in the temporary import of machined 2x4 lumber from Lowes or HomeDepot. I would suggest having a picture of the assembled stages just for clarity. I'm pretty sure that the CBSA guys will never have seen such a thing before.

Bringing goods in to sell is a bit more complicated. As the letter notes, you have to list the goods and their value on form B3 or possibly E29B. Duty and taxes have to be paid on importation. A refund will be issued for unsold goods which you then re-export. My understanding is that for sales within the event, you do not need a work permit. If you hawk your wares on the street corner, that might be a different situation.

In response to your correspondence dated March 10, 2015 the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) - International Events and Convention Services Program (IECSP) officially recognizes the following event:

International Jugglers' Association Festival (IJA)
July 20 - 26, 2015
Cégep Limoilou, École de cirque de Québec et Impérial Bell
Quebec, QC

The information provided to the CBSA states there will be approximately 700 attendees to which approximately 70% are foreign to Canada and that the event is open to the general public with sales.

As outlined in your correspondence, this event is expecting approximately 20 foreign exhibitors who are importing juggling equipment, tee-shirts, DVDs, books and hats etc. for use at the event.

It should be noted that, non-Canadian exhibitors may import display items and exhibit booths temporarily as outlined in the provisions of tariff classification 9993.00.00.00 duty free, on the condition that the goods will be exported from Canada upon the completion of the event.

Goods imported for sale are not eligible under tariff No. 9993.00.00.00. These goods must be accounted for at time of release on a [Form B3](#), *Canada Customs Coding Form*. Commercial release processing is fully explained in Customs Memorandum [D17-1-5](#).

Goods imported as "giveaways" must be accounted for at time of release on a [Form B3](#), *Canada Customs Coding Form* with all applicable duties and/or taxes collected at the time of importation.

Under certain circumstances, the CBSA will require a security deposit on goods temporarily imported to Canada. These goods are normally documented on the Temporary Admission Permit (Form E29B).

At the time of exportation, goods granted temporary admission on a Form E29B or Carnet must be presented along with importer's/owner's copies of the appropriate documentation to CBSA for verification and certification. This presentation may occur at a CBSA office inland or at the port of export, depending on the circumstances involved and is necessary for you to receive a refund of any securities posted. Please note that the refund is not immediate.

CBSA requires everyone seeking admission into Canada to properly declare themselves to CBSA by providing accurate identification. CBSA will accept a valid passport as proof of citizenship.

Persons who have been convicted of any criminal offences may be inadmissible to Canada. For more information please visit: www.cic.gc.ca/english/information/inadmissibility/index.asp

If you have attendees from visa-requiring countries (www.cic.gc.ca/english/visit/visas.asp), please contact the Special Events Unit of Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) at special.events@cic.gc.ca with the specifics of your event. They will assess the visa requirements of your event.

Foreign nationals may engage in exhibiting, selling or displaying goods without a work permit provided they are not selling to the general public. Direct sales to the general public require a work permit. For more information please visit: www.cic.gc.ca/english/work/index.asp

As indicated in your correspondence, the following considerations should be reviewed as they may affect the importation of event goods.

With regards to the importation of the “Gauntlet” most articles of lumber imported without bark from the U.S. are “approved” to enter Canada without any permit requirements. However, it is recommend you contact the Canadian Food Inspection Agency’s National Import Service Centre and provide them with the exact details of the wood, including species type, country/U.S. state of origin in order to confirm the import requirements.

To facilitate border procedures it is recommended that exhibitors be provided a copy of this letter for presentation to a CBSA Border Services Officer upon their arrival to Canada.

In conjunction with the presentation of this Recognition Letter, an itemized list of goods including a description, country of origin, quantity and value is required for presentation to CBSA. If your event materials will be imported by a commercial carrier or courier service, a copy of this letter should also be attached to any shipping documents.
