École de Cirque de Québec at Lexington by Melissa Legge

The École de Cirque de Québec in Quebec City, Canada has been invited to do a presentation this year at the IJA festival. Yves Neveu, the general director of the school, says that the school hopes to show a little bit of what it's about to the IJA.

The school is in the midst of preparing itself for a forty-minute showcase of both circus and juggling numbers. They are in the process of choosing what numbers will be presented at the festival. Although many of the details remain to be decided, there are already some finalized participants. American juggler Cate Flaherty and Ryunosuke (Ray) Yamazumi from Japan are two of the participants who have already been confirmed to attend.

Flaherty specializes in combination juggling and handbalancing, and Yamazumi juggles up to five spinning balls, and specializes also in walking globe. Both are trained in acrobatics, dance, physical theatre and a variety of other circus diciplines. Neveu says that they have been chosen for their unique skill sets and to show to the IJA the type of evolution that can happen to a juggler at the school.

Neveu says that he looks forward to get to "share what we are with other people." He says, "For me the school is a place that's warm, inviting, welcoming; where many people can find their place. We're maybe not on the most typical or traditional path."

The school has already had some publicity this year in the juggling community because of Turbo Fest 2008, held in January. "In the circle of jugglers we have a certain reputation, partially because of Turbo 418, who have done a good job promoting what the kind of work we do here is," says Neveu. He looks forward to having the chance "to show to the public the evolution that has taken place here over the past few years."

Neveu says that the school is flattered to have been invited to Kentucky and are looking forward to being there. He is confident that the showcase will be of an interesting and impressive level, and to anyone who expects a student-level show he says, "We will take them by surprise."

The IJA Electronic Roster by Don Lewis

The online Roster is published several times a year for the benefit of members. This document is available on the forum as a PDF format document.

There is a feature of the PDF format that limits the ability to copy the contents. The reality is that this protection only works on some computer systems while other systems completely ignore it.

At a recent IJA Board meeting, a motion was tabled to remove the copy protection from the roster. The rationale is that the current limitation simply makes it difficult for the member who wants to cut and paste a single address, without offering any real impediment to someone who would try to extract all the addresses.

There is a lively discussion on the IJA forum that is split between fear of rampant spam and ease of use. A series of guidelines is emerging that will likely appear on an upcoming Roster publication. Gas Prices Got You Down? by Don Lewis

I've heard quite a few jugglers worry that the price of gas is going to limit their ability to get to festivals. There is no getting around the fact that gas prices are expensive. On a recent trip through the US I paid as much as \$3.49 a gallon. When I sat down and worked out how much extra the trip had cost compared to the last time, it was about \$20. And that was over a distance of nearly 2000 kilometers. Not enough to keep me at home. It is easy to have a reflex reaction when faced with cost increases. But work it out and decide if you're going to let it rule your life.

Just to keep gas prices in perspective, I've been paying as much as \$1.34 per liter for regular gas in Quebec. That works out to over \$5.00 per US gallon.
