

Having a Juggling Festival? List it here!

If you're organizing a juggling festival (or if you simply know of a juggling fest) and you want to advertise it in the IJA eNewsletter, just drop a note to eNewsletter editor Don Lewis enews@juggle.org. Such listings are free.

The eNewsletter generally comes out near the end of each month. Your festival can be listed for a few months, and you don't have to be an IJA affiliate to have a fest listed. Hey, jugglers want to know about juggling fests. Help them out and get more jugglers to your fest at the same time.

Basic Club Tricks - continued, by Don Lewis

Thumb Roll

The thumb roll is another one handed trick where the club just stays in your hand. It looks like a simple trick, and it is if you do it slowly.

Stand comfortably with your arms at your side. Raise one forearm so that is horizontal to the ground, palm up. Keep the elbow near your waist. Place a club in that hand with the handle pointing towards you. Hold the club near the centre so that the balance point is just a bit ahead where your thumb and forefinger meet.

You are going to roll the club around the back of your thumb and let it fall back into your hand. Gently swing the handle away from you while opening your hand. As the club swings around, turn your hand so that your thumb is on top, palm about vertical. You want to balance the club on the back of your thumb as it continues to swing around in a horizontal circle.

As the club completes the circle, turn your hand back to the horizontal and let the club drop back into your palm. That is a thumb roll.

Initially it can be a bit difficult to find the balance point, and to stay centered under that point as the club rotates. As you become more adept at keeping the back of your thumb under the balance point, the easier and slower the trick becomes. Start by just doing one roll and stop. Then do it again. Eventually the club will just fall back into your hand in the right position to keep going. A small flick with the thumb on each rotation turns this into a continuous trick. This is a good trick to practice while watching TV.

To add this trick to your three club cascade, juggle column doubles in one hand while doing as many thumb rolls as you like in the other hand. Since you are doing two quite different things in each hand, this can be a bit of a challenge. Concentrate on keeping the thumb roll going while you get those doubles under control on the other side.

You don't actually have to add this in to your pattern. It looks quite cool all by itself. A thumb roll is an insouciant thing to do on your way to pick up a dropped club.

This brings us to the end of the basic three club tricks workshop. Come and see the real thing in Winston-Salem this summer with live demonstrations.

Meanwhile, look back a few issues to the under the arm trick. This trick is the foundation for Chops which will be described in an upcoming newsletter.
