



Thursday was mostly juggling and socializing. There were two film crews present throughout the convention: Red Lynde's Cine-man crew, who were filming a juggling documentary for PBS, and a crew from "Big Blue Marble," another PBS show.

On Friday the IJA Championships were held. This year the competition was more interesting than past year's competitions, with some jugglers performing routines to music, and a record 5 club juggle by Steve Mills of 69.6 seconds!

The Business Meeting was held Friday night. New officers were elected (see front page) and old and new business was discussed. The West Coast was selected for next year's Convention. Art Jennings gave a short speech.

After the Meeting, juggling went on into the night, with some jugglers sleeping on the YMCA steps.

On Saturday, there was more juggling in the morning. A public show was performed outside in downtown Youngstown by Dr. California's Golden Gate Remedy Troup.

At 2 p.m. there was a scheduled public show, which was held at the Southern Park Mall shopping center. Bob Blau was the M.C. Performing in the show were: "The Prince of Jugglers" Paul Bachman, Sascha Krakow, "The Fantasy Jugglers" Don Reed and Lana Roberts, Martin Gray, Dick "Franco" Francis, Mike Moschen-Penn Jillette-Karen Gersch, Jay Green, Joe Parnar and Lheith, and Peter Kogen. Juggling Documentary

You may remember some filming going on at the convention. Part of it was for a 60-minute, public television special entitled Juggling (see the article in the Newsletter published immediately before the convention). On two evenings in September (9, 10) some jugglers and filmmakers in the Northeast got together at Red and Suzy Lynde's house near Boston to look at the results of those efforts - approximately six hours of film. IJA members attending the screenings were Hovey and Judy Burgess, Don Reed, Lana Roberts, Sophie Parker and Red Lynde, plus several non-IJA'ers interested either in juggling or in film or, in some cases, in both. What more appreciative audience could there be?

The footage really is quite good, and a great deal of credit is due to the subjects of the filming - the jugglers themselves. Without the considerable cooperation of the jugglers at the convention, the filmmakers would have been overcome by the confusion and the pressures of time, and might not have been able to get on film the very interesting material they ultimately came up with. A big thank you goes out to the jugglers for living up to the IJA pledge to be helpful ("to render assistance to other jugglers").


